Taking a walk towards the river, get an amazing view from the 8th floor of the brand new TFCornerstone apartments, where there are 5 solo shows in gallery-like apartments overlooking Manhattan. Head back to Vernon Blvd via 5-25 46th Ave for The Crew's Opening, then back on Vernon, where Evandro Tech Motors once again has cleared out their vintage cars to show the vintage car photos and other amazing works of LIC's living legend, Tony Vaccaro. While there, experience a glimpse and taste of Peru. On your way to the Open's Opening Party at The Local on 44th Ave, finish your Vernon Blvd Nabe Night crawl at PaintCan Studios on 10th St, to see a few of the many members of LIC Artists who will be showing in alternative places throughout LIC.

## JEFFREY LEDER GALLERY TALK - THE WALLS

May 15 // 8-10pm

Various 5 Pointz artists will briefly discuss their start in the aerosol art world through graffiti.

The focus of the panel will be: walls and the scales of the body of work, the rewards of doing public art, the impact their art can have or had on a street and block, the evolution of their individual styles, and the challenges of moving to canvases.


